  - 2) His disciples?
  - 3) Peter?

4. Jesus identifies Himself as the man the mob looking for, using the phrase, "I am He" (lit. "I Am" vv.5, 6+8). How would you explain the reaction of those seeking to arrest Jesus (v.6)?

#### Reflection

5. Have you ever tried to obey Jesus only to either misunderstand God's plan, or be overzealous and ending up hurting someone? What happened?

6. What do you want to remember about Jesus and His responses in this passage the next time someone lets you down? How will this help?
