2. We become wise by studying and applying God's Word. Read James 1:5-8 followed by Psa. 119:97-100. What do these passages contribute to our understanding of Psa. 119:33-34?
3. In what ways does the psalmist seek the Lord's leading in verses 35-37? What are some present & practical examples of how we can do the same things?

4. The psalmist longs for God's answered prayers in v.38. What assurances do we have that God will answer our prayers? Does God answer every prayer?

5. What are some worthless/vain things that can distract us from following God (v.37)? How can we reset our focus?
6. Where have you experienced the leading of the Lord in your life? How did God direct you?
