2. Paul warned strong believers not to simply please themselves (v.1). Read 1 Thess. 2:5-12 and 2 Tim. 2:24-26. How do these passages help us to understand what "pleasing ourselves" looks like or doesn't look like?

3. Paul prays for Christians to "be of the same mind" (v.5). Does this sort of unity mean that believers must come to the same opinions or convictions about everything? If so, why? If not, what does unity mean?

4. What does it mean to "accept one another" (v.7)? Compare and contrast this verse with Rom. 14:1-3.

5. How can a church full of people with different experiences, desires, struggles, emotions, understanding, etc., ever expect to find unity?

6. When Scripture is not explicit on an issue, how should a person decide what is right and wrong?
